#### What's a Resolution?

(in its simplest form)

THE IDENTIFICATION OF A



**PROBLEM** 

THE PROPOSAL OF A



SOLUTION

#### Resolutions relate to:

- UCTE By-laws, Finance, Regulations, or Policies
- PSAC Constitution or Regulations (including Regulation 15 re: Collective Bargaining policy)
- National Joint Council policies
- Miscellaneous

Resolutions always deal with just ONE problem.

If you want to address more than one problem...

Create more than one resolution.

#### Who Can Submit a Resolution?

#### **LOCALS**

Resolutions adopted at Local meetings can be brought to UCTE's National Convention

#### **NATIONAL EXECUTIVE**

Resolutions adopted by the National Executive can be brought to UCTE's National Convention

## 2 ways to write a resolution:



#### TRADITIONAL:

**Uses "WHEREAS" and "BE IT RESOLVED"** 



#### **PLAIN LANGUAGE:**

Uses "BECAUSE" and "UCTE WILL" or "PSAC WILL"

#### Parts of a Resolution

There are 2 parts to a resolution:

WHEREAS / BECAUSE

**Identifies the problem** 

BE IT RESOLVED / UCTE or PSAC WILL

Identifies the solution

#### Whereas or Because

- Identifies the problem clearly and provides any necessary background
- Answers: WHY? (WHY is this a problem? WHY is the solution necessary?)
- One thought per whereas or because

#### Be It Resolved or UCTE/PSAC Will

- Identifies the solution clearly
- Needs to stand on its own
- Answers the questions:

WHAT? (What is the solution?)

WHO? (Who will undertake it?)

WHEN? (By when will it occur?)

WHERE? (Where will the solution happen?)

#### Example using traditional language:

WHEREAS it has been identified that re-establishing a defined benefit plan is important for every bargaining unit; and

WHEREAS many private sector locals struggle to maintain this proposal in bargaining; therefore

**BE IT RESOLVED** that any UCTE Bargaining unit that is not on a defined benefit plan must place a proposal for a defined benefit plan in their bargaining package; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this bargaining proposal will only be withdrawn with the permission of the UCTE Component President

#### Example using plain language:

**BECAUSE** it has been identified that re-establishing a defined benefit plan is important for every bargaining unit; and

**BECAUSE** many private sector locals struggle to maintain this proposal in bargaining; therefore

**UCTE WILL DIRECT** any UCTE Bargaining unit that is not on a defined benefit plan to place a proposal for a defined benefit plan in their bargaining package; and

**UCTE WILL ALSO HAVE** it that this bargaining proposal will only be withdrawn with the permission of the UCTE Component President

## The path of a Resolution

An individual or a group identify a problem

AND a solution

This
problem can
be resolved
through
changing or
adding to:

UCTE Resolution form completed

Resolution debated and adopted at:

Resolution sent to National Office

- UCTE By-Laws, Finance, Regulations or Policies
- PSAC Constitution or Regulations (including Regulation 15 re: Collective Bargaining policy
- National Joint Council policies; or
- Miscellaneous (over which UCTE has jurisdiction)

- Local meeting; or
- National Executive meeting

## The path of a Resolution

National
President
reviews
resolutions
and provides
feedback
(if necessary)


All

Convention
Committee
determines
concurrence
or nonconcurrence

Resolution is brought to 20<sup>th</sup> Triennial National Convention 2026

- Locals change resolution & submit by deadline; or
- Locals don't change resolution

# Sample Resolution Forms





#### To Note

- There is a 150-word limit on resolutions
- The 150-word limit includes the "Whereas" and "Be It Resolved" portions of the resolution (or clear language equivalent) but will not include the title of the resolution
- Any proposed language change to the UCTE By-laws or PSAC Constitution included in the resolution will not be part of the 150-word count

#### When are resolutions submitted?

- Following a call for resolutions from UCTE National Office
- Deadline is <u>January 30, 2026</u>
- Sent by email to <u>ucte-convention@psac-afpc.com</u>

# Supplementary resolutions

- are received after deadline,
- were not able to be reviewed by the convention committee,
- are looked at, if time permits, during convention.

# Emergency resolutions



Deal with a problem not identified (or in existence) prior to the final date for receipt of resolutions.

#### **Best Practices**

#### Keep it simple

WHEREAS or BECAUSE:

BE IT RESOLVED or UCTE or PSAC WILL:

- Identifies the problem clearly and provides any necessary background
- Answers: WHY? (WHY is this a problem? WHY is the solution necessary?)
- One thought per whereas
- Identifies the solution clearly
- Needs to stand on its own
- Answers the questions:

WHAT? (What is the solution?)

WHO? (Who will undertake it?)

WHEN? (By when will it occur?)

WHERE? (Where will the solution happen?)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

Identifies a follow up to the solution
